I am writing in support of the nomination of Marcia Parcell, Purdue University, for the Vice President of Professional Development position for the National Extension Association of Family and Consumer Sciences.

Marcia began her Purdue University Extension career in 2007 in Ohio County as the HHS/4-H Educator. In 2010, she moved to Dearborn County as the 4-H Educator and in 2014, switched to the HHS Educator in Dearborn County.

In 2022, she was the honored recipient of the NEAFCS Distinguished Service Award. From 2017-2022, she has also served many roles for the National Extension Association of Family and Consumer Sciences such as Indiana Affiliate President, Vice President, and Secretary.

Marcia has demonstrated exemplary leadership and professionalism for Indiana regionally and nationally. She is the past chair of Area 1 HHS, serves as a mentor for new educators in Area 1, and is a member of the NEAFCS Professional Development Committee. Marcia has also served as the secretary, Co-Chair, and Past Chair of the committee.

Marcia has very assertive Health and Human Sciences programs addressing many of the issues pertinent to her county and the state that has resulted in positive impacts at the local and county level. For example, Marcia has taught the HHS signature program, Captain Cash, for nine years and has reached over 1,350 third and fourth grades. She has also presented another HHS signature program, Dining with Diabetes in person and virtually in multiple counties. In this program, participants learn how to prepare foods they enjoy in a way to reduce calories, fat and sodium, and increase dietary fiber. After the program, participants shared they learned about substitutes that are healthier, which foods spike our sugar, and reading the second half of a nutrition label.

During her career with Purdue University Extension, Marcia is a part of the Navigating Difference team and is trained to present Mental Health First Aid (MHFA) for adults, trained to present Strengthening Families Program: For Parents and Youth 10-14, served as an EEO counselor, and is the current

liaison for Indiana Extension Homemakers Association. She currently maintains her professional memberships in Epsilon Sigma Phi Extension Honorary, Alpha Lambda Chapter, the Indiana Extension Educators Association, and the National Extension Association for Family and Consumer Sciences.

Over her Extension career, Marcia has participated at multiple national conferences, including the 2009 Galaxy Conference, 2008 NEAFCS Conference, ELC 2021, PILD 2020, and NAE4HA.

I have worked with Marcia Parcell in several capacities and I am proud to say she is a Purdue Extension Consumer and Family Sciences educator. It is my distinct pleasure to support her nomination for the NEAFCS Vice President of Professional Development.
