# HISTORY OF ORGANIZATION.

The Oklahoma Home Demonstration Agents! Association was organized October 19, 1940. The organization meeting was held in the Annex of the college cafeteria during the annual Extension workers Conference. The organization was an outgrowth of several things: (1) The County Agents of Oklahoma had a very successful state organization. (2) The Home Demonstration Agents knew there was a national organization of Home Demonstration Agents. (3) The Home Demonstration Agents. (4) Some of the district had an organization of its Agents.

Object of this in the constitution: Association shall be to provide a permament state organization for Home Demonstration Agents of Oklahoma whereby professional standards are raised, fellowship among its members is promoted; a centralized means for the exchange of ideas and methods is provided; and a cooperation is given to the County Agents Association. (2) Membership - "Those eligible for membership shall be Agents actively engaged in Home Demonstration (3) The Executive work in counties." Board shall consist of the four elective officers and a councilor from each of the four Extension districts; each counsilor to be elected by her own district.
