Major Accomplishments

Our national office expanded NEAFCS's electronic effectiveness by putting the awards application (571 submitted) and annual session registration on-line for the first time.

Electronic eNEAFCS sent monthly to members. (first one April 2003)

NEAFCS started several new initiatives this past year –a NEAFCS Endowment and ad hoc committees to develop professional ethnics and standards and for international FCS programming.

New Ad Hoc Committee – International NEAFCS started in 2004 and sponsored a session at Annual Session and started online member international experiences listing. It later become permanent under Public Affairs as a subcommittee

New Ad Hoc Committee – Professional Standards and Ethics started in 2004 and discussed professional principles. They developed the NEAFCS Principles of Professional Ethics approved in December 2004. They also wrote a powerpoint and self assessment for members to use with peers and staff.

Annual Session

We had a day-long pre-conference called "Strong Women" featuring Dr. Miriam Nelson, from Tufts University. She also gave the keynote speech. Other General session speakers included: Robbie Kendall-Meton, PhD and Crystal A. Kuykendall, JD,EdD

Annual session was shortened and ended Thursday, Oct. 6 evening after the awards banquet.

The Leadership/Life Member event was held in Clarksville about 50 miles north of Nashville at the Smith-Trahem Mansion. It is the home of the Montgomery County Family & Community Education (FCE) club and restored by them in a unique partnership with the city.

The Friendship Event was held within walking distance at the Country Music Hall of Fame.
